

You don't need to know anything about wine to use this list; just choose the style you like, and the pairing guide below will help you find a good match for your meal.

Most of all, we hope this list encourages you to try something you'll genuinely enjoy — whether that's a favourite classic or something new.

Each wine includes a small pairing letter to make choosing easier:

S – seafood & lighter fish

P – poultry & lighter meats

V – vegetarian dishes & lighter starters

C – cheese

SPARKLING & CHAMPAGNE

300. Champagne Baron-Fuenté Brut NV — €75 S • F • P

A fresh, inviting Champagne with crisp orchard fruit, gentle brioche and subtle floral lift. The mousse is fine and persistent, carrying flavours of apple, pear and soft citrus across a clean, elegant palate. Hints of almond and subtle autolysis add finesse. A refined, crowd-pleasing style ideal for receptions or as a versatile aperitif.

301. Champagne Bollinger Special Cuvée — €120 S • F • P • R

Rich, Pinot-Noir-driven depth with layers of apple, toasted brioche and subtle spice. The palate delivers power balanced with precision, showing Bollinger's signature structure and density. Long, savoury finish with touches of honey and roasted nuts. Benchmark Champagne for those who appreciate complexity and pedigree.

302. Bollinger Rosé NV — €156 S • F • P

A beautifully expressive rosé with wild strawberry, raspberry and blood orange framed by fine mousse. Notes of rose petals, subtle spice and light toast enrich the palate. Dry, elegant and structured with superb length. A luxurious rosé Champagne of real presence.

303. Bolney Estate "Bolney Bubbly" NV (England) — €80 S • F • P

A crisp, modern English sparkling with vibrant citrus, baked apple and subtle pastry notes. The cool climate delivers excellent acidity and precision. Clean, refreshing and finely textured. An impressive example of England's rising sparkling reputation.

304. Louis Bouillot Crémant de Bourgogne Brut — €49 S • F

Bright, refined and delicately creamy, offering citrus zest, white flowers and touches of almond. Soft brioche notes add depth without heaviness. A superb value alternative to Champagne with real finesse.

305. Bottega Gold Prosecco Brut — €45 S • F

Fresh golden apple, white peach and floral lift with a smooth, approachable mousse. Light, refreshing and beautifully presented. A reliable favourite with broad appeal, ideal for celebrations.

306. Prosecco Frizzante NV — €30 S • F

Soft pear, apple and gentle citrus notes define this lightly sparkling, easy-drinking style. Smooth, clean and versatile with a pleasantly rounded finish. A perfect everyday Prosecco.

WHITE WINES

AUSTRIA

310. Domäne Wachau Riesling Federspiel Terrassen 2018 — €48 S • F • C

A precise, mineral-driven Riesling with lime zest, white peach and crystalline freshness. The palate is sleek and vibrant, layered with flinty tension and subtle herbal lift. Long, refreshing and beautifully structured. Classic Wachau purity.

311. Gemischter Satz 2014 — €42 S • F • C

From 17 co-planted varieties, this traditional Viennese field blend offers remarkable complexity. Aromas of citrus, spice, hay and blossom lead into a textured palate with lively acidity and gentle savoury notes. Unique, characterful and highly food-friendly.

GERMANY

315. Willi Haag Brauneberger Juffer Riesling Auslese 2001 — €88 S • F • C

Mature Riesling at its finest: honeyed citrus, candied lime, apricot and subtle petrol notes. The palate is luscious yet beautifully balanced by zesty acidity. Layers of fruit and a long, elegant finish make this a standout Auslese from a superb site.

316. Bender Paulessen Riesling 2018 — €35 S • F

Aromatic and fresh, with ripe apricot, apple and gentle florals supported by lively minerality. Medium-light on the palate with clean, refreshing acidity. A versatile, very drinkable Riesling.

317. Hochheimer Domdechaney Riesling Trocken Goldkapsel 2014 — €65 S • F • C

Peach, apricot, spice and mineral depth define this opulent dry Riesling. Rich mid-palate weight balanced by precise acidity. Long, aromatic finish with impressive structure. 92+ points quality.

318. Leitz Rüdesheimer Riesling Kabinett 2010 — €48 S • F • C

Juicy citrus, stone fruit and gentle sweetness with excellent lift and clarity. Bright acidity keeps everything fresh and lively. Perfect with lighter dishes or as a refreshing standalone glass.

ITALY — WHITE

329. Zagalia Pinot Grigio 2022 — €32 S • F

Crisp, clean and refreshing with green apple, citrus and a touch of white blossom. Light-bodied, easy and highly versatile. Ideal for guests seeking something uncomplicated and fresh.

330. Michele Chiarlo “Palás” Gavi 2022 — €45 S • F • C

Fresh citrus, green apple and soft white almond with clean, mineral lift. Silky and refreshing, offering the signature finesse of Cortese grown on premium Piedmont soils. A refined, elegant Italian white that's effortless to drink and perfectly balanced with food. Ideal smooth upgrade from Pinot Grigio.

331. Pio Cesare Langhe Chardonnay | 2015 — €90 R • F

A rare, beautifully matured Chardonnay from one of Piemonte's most historic producers. Layers of lemon oil, baked apple and almond cream unfold over a subtle smoky minerality. The 2015 vintage brings depth and gentle richness while retaining the region's signature restraint. A refined, barrel-aged Italian white with Burgundy-like texture and real complexity — exceptional for someone seeking something luxurious yet distinctive.

332. Les Crêtes Petite Arvine | 2013 — €80 R • S

High-altitude Alpine white from one of Italy's most iconic mountain estates. The 2013 vintage brings honeyed citrus, alpine herbs, and crystalline minerality with remarkable freshness despite its age. Petite Arvine offers a rare combination of weight and tension — silky mid-palate, salty finish — and is a sommelier favourite for pairing with seafood, creamy dishes, and anything delicate. A distinctive, conversation-starting wine for guests who want something truly unique.

FRANCE — ALSACE / CHABLIS

333. Hugel Riesling 2016 — €35 S • F • C

Classic Alsatian dryness with citrus, white flowers and light stone fruit. Clean, bright acidity gives precision and lift. A pure, elegant Riesling ideal for seafood and lighter dishes.

336. Chablis A.C. Collet 2023 — €55 S • F • C

A pure and vibrant expression of classic Chablis, offering crisp green apple, lemon zest and white peach with beautifully clean lines. The 2023 vintage delivers exceptional freshness, supported by the unmistakable salty–chalky minerality of Kimmeridgian limestone — the signature that makes true Chablis stand apart. Bright acidity and precise structure give the wine lift and tension, while subtle floral notes add finesse on the finish. A benchmark, seafood-friendly Chablis that brings real pedigree and elegance to the glass.

337. Domaine Gérard Collet Chablis 1er Cru 2022 — €80 S • F • C

Richer and more textural, showing citrus, stone fruit and saline minerality. Layers unfold with air, offering depth and refinement. A superb Premier Cru Chablis of precision and character.

338. Chablis Grand Cru “Vaudésir” 2008 — €135 S • F • C

A beautifully evolved Grand Cru showing layered notes of citrus oil, hazelnut, dried white flowers and subtle almond. The palate is refined and mineral-driven, with Vaudésir’s hallmark combination of power and delicacy. Aged gracefully, it offers deep salinity, silky texture and remarkable length shaped by Kimmeridgian limestone soils. A rare mature Chablis of genuine pedigree — elegant, complex and drinking at its peak.

FRANCE — BURGUNDY (CÔTE DE BEAUNE / MÂCONNAIS)

339. Henri & Gilles Buisson Saint-Romain “Sous la Velle” 2011 — €75 S • F • P • C

Stone fruit, light oak and fresh mineral tension give this white Burgundy elegance and subtle power. Textured mid-palate with refined acidity and a long, clean finish. A beautifully balanced wine from one of Burgundy’s great value villages.

349. Pouilly-Fuissé “Les Préludes” Terres Secrètes 2023 — €75 S • P • C

Ripe stone fruit, lemon zest and subtle toasted oak with a clean mineral backbone. Elegant and expressive Mâconnais Chardonnay offering Burgundian finesse at a superb price. Creamy yet refreshing, with excellent balance and length on the palate. A luxurious pairing for poultry, salmon or richer cream-based dishes.

350. Domaine Emilian Gillet Viré-Clessé 2021 — €55 S • P • C

A beautifully expressive Mâconnais Chardonnay with ripe orchard fruit, white peach and subtle citrus blossom. The palate is rounded but lifted, showing creamy texture balanced by elegant, refreshing acidity. Distinctive notes of honeyed stone fruit and gentle spice reveal the appellation's limestone-rich terroir.

An outstanding Viré-Clessé — refined, complex and superb value in the world of white Burgundy.

351. Maison Louis Latour Meursault 2017 — €140 S • P • C

Classic Meursault with lemon curd, stone fruit, hazelnut and fine oak. Silky palate weight balanced by mineral lift. Long and luxurious with excellent polish.

340. Louis Latour Corton-Charlemagne Grand Cru 2005 — €376 S • P • C

A monumental Grand Cru from an exceptional, long-lived vintage. The 2005 Corton-Charlemagne combines intense concentration with the cool, chiselled minerality of the Corton hill — a style that only reveals itself with age. The nose shows layered aromas of lemon oil, baked apple, toasted hazelnut and subtle smoke, evolving into hints of honey, lanolin and flint as it opens. On the palate, the wine is powerful and structured, driven by deep limestone minerality and vibrant acidity that has preserved remarkable freshness after nearly two decades. Long, resonant and complex, this is mature Grand Cru Burgundy at its finest — a rare bottle entering its peak drinking window.

FRANCE — LOIRE (SAUVIGNON BLANC)

352. Domaine Serge Laloue Sancerre “Cuvée Silex” 2020 — €66 S • F

Crisp citrus, white flowers and a distinctive flinty minerality from pure silex soils. Precise, aromatic and beautifully layered; a benchmark expression of Sancerre elegance. Long, refreshing finish that pairs naturally with seafood and lighter dishes. A refined Loire classic with striking purity and finesse.

353. Domaine Fouassier Sancerre “Les Grands Champs” 2023 — €72 S • F

Bright citrus, peach and subtle herbal notes lifted by clean limestone minerality. Organic, single-vineyard Sancerre with impressive depth and purity of fruit. Dry, elegant and beautifully balanced with excellent mid-palate weight. Luxurious and complex Sancerre experience.

SPAIN — WHITE

358. Pionero Albariño 2020 — €42 S • F

Vibrant, Atlantic-influenced Albariño with ripe peach, pineapple and citrus zest lifted by fresh saline minerality. The palate is crisp and refreshing, offering stone-fruit purity, subtle floral notes and a clean, mouthwatering finish. Hand-harvested from coastal vineyards in Rías Baixas, where cool ocean breezes preserve natural acidity and precision. A benchmark seafood wine — aromatic, lively and exceptionally versatile at the table.

359. Ameztoi Txakoli di Getaria 2018 — €39 S • F

Light spritz, citrus and mineral freshness define this Basque favourite. Crisp and extremely refreshing with natural seafood affinity.

361. Tempestad Godello 2017 — €40 S • F • P

Green apple, pear and subtle stone fruit with a rounded palate and fine mineral touch. A textured, elegant Godello.

AUSTRALIA — WHITE

362. Willowglen Gewürztraminer–Riesling 2020 — €32 S • F • P

Aromatic lychee, citrus and spice with soft sweetness balanced by refreshing acidity. Crowd-pleasing and versatile with aromatic dishes.

363. Xanadu Estate Chardonnay | 2021 — €50 F • C

A beautifully luxurious Margaret River Chardonnay with layers of ripe peach, citrus cream and vanilla-spiced French oak. Silky and refined on the palate, offering the richness of top-tier white Burgundy but with a warmer, more generous Australian elegance. Winner of multiple national awards and consistently rated among Australia's finest estates. A smooth, classy upgrade from house wine — indulgent, polished and effortlessly enjoyable.

NEW ZEALAND — WHITE

364. Emperor Point Sauvignon Blanc 2022 — €32 S • F

Gooseberry, grapefruit and fresh herbs with crisp acidity and clean, vibrant finish. Classic Marlborough style.

365. Cloudy Bay Sauvignon Blanc 2020 — €55 S • F

Vibrant grapefruit, lime and passionfruit with sleek mineral precision. Bright, aromatic and beautifully structured; the benchmark for Marlborough Sauvignon Blanc. Delivers both freshness and depth, with an instantly recognisable world-class style. A luxury alternative for guests who want something iconic yet approachable

USA — WHITE

366. Grgich Hills Estate Chardonnay 2020 — €75 S • P • C

Benchmark Napa Chardonnay offering vibrant citrus, baked apple and ripe pineapple wrapped in a beautifully balanced, non-malolactic style. The palate is elegant and finely textured, showing Grgich's signature purity with hints of hazelnut, white blossom and restrained French oak. Bright acidity and mineral drive reflect the estate's biodynamic vineyards and cool Napa Valley nights. An iconic California Chardonnay from the winemaker that famously defeated the French at the 1976 Judgement of Paris — refined, expressive and impeccably crafted.

ROSÉ

370. Le Grand Noir Rosé 2022 — €32 S • F • P

Pale and refreshing with raspberry, strawberry and light spice. Dry, crisp and highly drinkable. A versatile, modern rosé.

371. Whispering Angel Rosé 2020 — €50 S • F • P

Delicate red berries, citrus and subtle minerality with polished texture. The world's most recognisable luxury rosé — elegant, refined and consistently excellent.

RED WINES

ITALY — PIEMONTE

372. Paolo Conterno “Riva del Bric” Barolo 2020 — €62 R • C

Classic Nebbiolo expression with red cherry, dried rose, anise and fine savoury complexity. The palate is elegant yet firm, carried by Barolo’s hallmark tannins and lifted acidity. Layers of spice and dried herbs emerge with air, giving structure and depth. A refined, traditional Barolo with exceptional balance and value.

373. Michele Chiarlo “Tortoniano” Barolo | 2021 — €125 R • C

Red cherry, rose and sweet spice with polished tannins; sourced from Tortonian soils rich in blue marl that give Barolo its elegant, aromatic style. Chiarlo’s precision winemaking creates a refined, early-drinking interpretation with classic depth and balance.

374. Prunotto Barolo 2014 — €160 R • C

A polished, traditional Barolo showing wild berries, tobacco leaf, dried flowers and subtle spice. Silky and refined on the palate with finely woven tannins and impressive length. Slow maturation has softened the edges, creating a harmonious, complex wine ideal for pairing with richly flavoured meats and aged cheeses.

375. Voerzio Gianni Barolo “La Serra” 1997 — €360 R • C

A rare mature Barolo offering evolved notes of dried cherry, truffle, leather and forest floor. The palate is graceful and delicate with softened tannins and lingering savoury nuance. A beautifully aged Nebbiolo showing remarkable elegance and tertiary depth. A collector’s bottle for connoisseurs.

ITALY — VENETO

376. Tenute Falezza Amarone della Valpolicella 2018 — €90 R • C

Rich, opulent Amarone with generous black cherry, cocoa, dried fig and warm spice. The palate is full-bodied and velvety, shaped by soft tannins and a gently warming finish. Concentrated yet balanced, offering both richness and refinement. An excellent example of modern Amarone craftsmanship.

377. Stefano Accordini Amarone DOCG 2020 — €95 R • C

Deep, dark fruit layered with sweet spice, chocolate and dried herbs. Powerful but polished, showcasing fine tannins and impressive persistence. Complex and expressive with a long, enveloping finish. A premium Amarone built for indulgence.

378. Fattori Valpolicella Ripasso “Col de la Bastia” 2020 — €45 R • C

A bold, fruit-driven Ripasso with blackberry, plum, sweet spice and subtle chocolate notes. Plush mid-palate texture supported by gentle tannins. The Ripasso technique adds richness without heaviness, resulting in exceptional value and versatility.

ITALY — ABRUZZO

379. Amaranta Montepulciano d’Abruzzo 2018 — €50 R • C

A velvety, concentrated Montepulciano offering ripe black fruit, mocha and warm spice. Silky tannins balance the richness, leading to a long, generous finish. A benchmark Abruzzo red that punches far above its weight in both flavour and presence.

380. Ulisse Montepulciano d’Abruzzo 2022 — €32 R

Juicy red and black fruit lifted by floral notes and light spice. Soft, rounded tannins make this an easy, highly enjoyable wine. Fresh, vibrant and excellent value — ideal for guests seeking something smooth and approachable.

ITALY — TUSCANY

381. Carpineto Chianti Classico DOCG 2023 — €40 R • C

Bright red cherry, plum and subtle violet with clean Sangiovese freshness. Supple tannins, gentle spice and a balanced, savoury finish. A refined, authentic Chianti with excellent drinkability.

ITALY — SICILY

382. Tenuta di Castellaro “Nero Ossidiana” 2015 — €63 R • C

A striking volcanic blend with dark berry, wild herbs, smoked mineral and savoury spice. Medium-bodied yet complex, showing refined tannins and excellent tension. Distinctive and deeply characterful — a true expression of the Aeolian terroir.

SPAIN — JUMILLA

383. Sabatacha Monastrell 2018 — €45 R • C

Ripe dark berry, plum, sweet spice and earthy notes with soft, silky tannins. A warming, generous red showcasing the richness of Monastrell. Great depth for the price and an excellent pairing for grilled meats.

SPAIN — RIBERA DEL DUERO

384. 12 Linajes Reserva 2018 — €55 R • C

Dark berry, balsamic and subtle mocha with polished, ripe tannins. Layered and expressive Tempranillo showing Ribera del Duero structure and depth. Consistent 92+ ratings highlight its quality and elegance at this price point. A superb upgrade for Rioja lovers seeking more richness and power.

SPAIN — RIOJA

385. Conde Valdemar Crianza 2011 — €32 R

Classic Rioja charm with red cherry, vanilla, gentle spice and softened tannins from extended ageing. Smooth, elegant and highly approachable. A staple of traditional Rioja style.

386. Muga Reserva 2020 — €50 R • C

A beautifully balanced Reserva with blackberry, plum, clove and subtle oak influence. Medium-full body with rounded tannins and refined texture. A model of modern Rioja sophistication.

387. Muga Selección Especial 2018 — €70 R • C

Benchmark Rioja crafted only in the finest vintages. The 2018 Selección Especial marries Tempranillo with Garnacha, Mazuelo and Graciano, aged in Muga's own cooperage using 100% French oak, a rarity in Rioja and one of the reasons for its reputation among critics (94+ Parker). The palate is deep and layered: black cherry, mulberry and plum sit over notes of cedar, cocoa, warm spice and fine graphite. The tannins are incredibly polished, giving a silky, modern mouthfeel while still retaining Rioja Alta classicism. Fresh acidity keeps it vibrant, and the finish is long, refined and savoury. This bottling shows the bridge between tradition and modern Rioja, placing it stylistically between Gran Reserva elegance and Reserva richness. A superb food wine with roasted lamb, aged beef and richly flavoured dishes.

388. Muga Prado Enea Gran Reserva 2005 — €280 R • C

A legendary Rioja showing deep maturity: dried fruit, cedar, spice, leather and sweet tobacco. The palate is expansive, structured and endlessly layered. Truly one of the great Gran Reservas of Spain.

SPAIN — NAVARRA

389. Ochoa Tempranillo Reserva 2015 — €50 R • C

Dark berry, cedar and warm spice lead into a smooth, balanced palate. Well-integrated tannins and gentle oak influence make this a versatile and polished Reserva.

390. Ochoa Gran Reserva 2014 — €80 R • C

Profound Rioja crafted only in the finest vintages, offering black cherry, plum and warm spice wrapped in perfectly judged French oak. The palate is silky yet powerful, showing precision, graphite minerality and exceptional balance. A blend of Tempranillo, Garnacha and Mazuelo from high-altitude vineyards, giving freshness and real depth. A modern Rioja icon — structured, elegant and built to age beautifully..

SPAIN — PENEDÈS

392. Torres “Mas La Plana” Cabernet Sauvignon 2010 — €90 R • C

An internationally acclaimed Cabernet with cassis, violet and savoury herbs lifted by subtle graphite and cedar. Polished tannins and refined French oak give a Bordeaux-like silhouette, yet with Mediterranean richness. Sourced from the single vineyard that famously defeated top Bordeaux wines in the 1979 Gault Millau tasting. A benchmark Spanish Cabernet — complex, poised and consistently 92+ points.

FRANCE — BEAUJOLAIS

391. Karim Vionnet Fleurie | 2020 — €55 R • L

Silky, fragrant Fleurie from one of Beaujolais’ most respected artisan producers. Vibrant red cherry, rose petals and wild strawberry with soft, supple tannins and a lifted, floral finish. Gamay from the steep granitic slopes of Fleurie delivers purity, elegance and a Burgundy-like finesse at superb value. Light, aromatic and beautifully food-friendly — a perfect choice for guests seeking a refined, elegant red without heaviness

FRANCE — BURGUNDY (CÔTE DE NUITS)

393. Domaine Joseph Drouhin Gevrey-Chambertin | 2022 — €95 R • L

A refined and vibrant Gevrey-Chambertin expressing pure red cherry, cranberry and subtle violet notes characteristic of the excellent 2022 vintage. Silky tannins and lifted acidity give beautiful definition, while gentle oak adds elegance without overshadowing the fruit. Gevrey’s signature earthy minerality and savoury depth emerge on the palate, offering structure with impressive finesse. A superb introduction to Côte de Nuits sophistication — polished, expressive and exceptionally well made by one of Burgundy’s most historic domaine.

394. Bruno Clair “Champs Perdrix” 2008 — €130 R • C

Mature Pinot Noir offering aromas of dried red fruit, rose petal, mushroom and earthy depth. The palate is graceful and savoury with fine, resolved tannins. Drinking beautifully.

395. Domaine Lejeune Pommard 1er Cru “Les Argillières” 2011 — €90 R • C

Dense red fruit, earth and spice with Pommard’s signature structure. Firm yet refined tannins support a long, expressive finish. A serious, traditional Burgundy.

396. Bachey-Legros Santenay 1er Cru “Clos Rousseau – Les Fourneaux” 2022 — €89 R • C

A refined, expressive Premier Cru showing vibrant red cherry, wild strawberry and delicate floral notes typical of the exceptional 2023 vintage. Silky tannins and lifted acidity provide beautiful balance, while old vines deliver notable depth and concentration. The Les Fourneaux parcel — the warmest sector of Clos Rousseau — adds extra ripeness and subtle spice, giving the wine impressive length. A superb modern Burgundy: pure, textured and offering outstanding value for Premier Cru quality.

397. David Duband Nuits-Saint-Georges 2017 — €125 R • C

Lifted and energetic expression of Nuits-Saint-Georges, showing vibrant red cherry, raspberry and subtle wild herb notes. Duband’s trademark whole-cluster approach adds floral lift, spice and fine, silky tannins that give the wine its refined structure. The 2017 vintage brings purity and freshness, balancing ripe fruit with limestone-driven minerality and elegant length. A beautifully modern interpretation of NSG — precise, expressive and drinking perfectly now, with more complexity to come.

FRANCE — NORTHERN RHÔNE

399. Yves Cuilleron Côte-Rôtie “Bassenon” 2007 — €225 R • C

A superb Syrah–Viognier blend showing blackberry, violet, pepper and smoky minerality. Silky texture with layered depth and elegance. Complex, refined and beautifully aged.

FRANCE — SOUTHERN RHÔNE

400. Victor Berard Châteauneuf-du-Pape 2022 — €80 R • C

A classic blend of Grenache, Syrah and Mourvèdre from one of the Rhône’s most historic appellations. Ripe redcurrant, warm baking spice and dried herbs (garrigue) unfold over a supple, generous palate. The 2022 vintage shows youthful richness with polished tannins and a long, warming finish. A full-bodied, elegant expression of Châteauneuf that delivers both depth and drinkability — ideal for guests seeking a prestigious Southern Rhône wine without the premium price tag.

401. Laudun Côtes du Rhône Villages 2020 — €40 R

Dark plum, pepper, chocolate and hearty structure. Bold flavours with a muscular profile. Exceptional value for a substantial Rhône red.

402. Domaine Chapoutier Gigondas 2020 — €60 R • C

From the slopes of the Dentelles de Montmirail, this Gigondas combines power and finesse. Layers of dark cherry, raspberry and black pepper sit over savoury herbs and mineral depth. Chapoutier's signature purity shows in the balance between ripe fruit and structured tannins, with the 2020 vintage giving excellent freshness. A superb alternative to Châteauneuf-du-Pape — offering similar richness and complexity at a more accessible price..

FRANCE — MADIRAN

405. Château Montus Prestige 1997 — €265 R • C

A benchmark Madiran from Alain Brumont, the winemaker credited with transforming Tannat into a world-class grape. Rich aromas of black plum, dark cherry, licorice and spice set the tone. The palate is powerful yet refined, showing concentration balanced by mature tannins softened through long ageing. Layers of cassis, tobacco and earthy minerality reveal themselves slowly. A distinctive, age-worthy wine demonstrating the superior depth of Montus Prestige — complex, bold and beautifully evolved.

FRANCE — CAHORS

406. Château du Cèdre “Le Cèdre” 1998 — €180 R • C

This is one of the great mature Cahors wines, showing the depth and elegance that only long-aged Malbec can achieve. The 1998 opens with dark plum, blackberry compote, cocoa and tobacco leaf, layered with black truffle, leather and a subtle graphite edge. Fine, resolved tannins glide across the palate, carrying concentrated dark fruit wrapped in earthy complexity and the distinct mineral signature of Cahors' limestone terraces. A powerful yet beautifully evolved wine from Pascal and Jean-Marc Verhaeghe's flagship cuvée — long, savoury, and profoundly satisfying at maturity. Rare opportunity to experience old-world Malbec at its peak.

FRANCE — LOIRE (CABERNET FRANC)

407. Couly-Dutheil Chinon “Clos de l’Echo” 2008 — €205 R • C

One of Chinon’s greatest single vineyards, harvested from limestone-rich slopes directly below the historic fortress. The 2008 vintage shows remarkable maturity: redcurrant, wild cherry and graphite unfolding into cedar, tobacco leaf and subtle truffle. The palate is long and refined, with elegant Cabernet Franc tannins softened beautifully by age. A benchmark Loire red — complex, aromatic and Burgundian in finesse — ideal if your seeking a distinctive, cellar-aged alternative to mature Bordeaux.

FRANCE — ROUSSILLON

408. Château Séguela Tautavel 2020 — €40 R

Ripe blackberry, garrigue herbs and warm spice. Smooth, rounded and full of southern French character. Great value and excellent versatility.

FRANCE — PROVENCE (BANDOL)

409. Domaine Tempier Bandol 1997 — €150 R • C

A legendary Mourvèdre with dark fruit, leather, cigar box and deep savoury complexity. Mature, powerful and beautifully layered. One of Provence’s greatest wines.

FRANCE — BORDEAUX (HAUT-MÉDOC)

411. Château Citran 2020 — €55 R • C

A standout Haut-Médoc with real class and finesse. The 2020 vintage combines ripe cassis, plum and blackberry with lifted cedar, violets and subtle tobacco leaf. The palate is polished and supple, showing silky tannins and impressive freshness — a hallmark of Citran’s gravel and clay terroir. Elegant, balanced and immediately enjoyable, this is one of the best value Left Bank clarets, offering true Médoc character at a brilliant price.

**412. Château Lanessan | 2012 — €75
R • C**

A mature, classical Haut-Médoc showing soft cedar, cassis and dried herbal notes. The 2012 vintage has reached an elegant peak, with fine-grained tannins, gentle savoury complexity and a smooth, refined finish. A superb choice for guests seeking a traditional, fully developed Left Bank claret without stepping into the higher price brackets.

413. Château Cantemerle (5th Growth) 2015 — €120 R • C

Superb Left Bank classic from one of the great modern vintages. The 2015 Cantemerle is beautifully expressive, showing blackcurrant, plum and sweet tobacco with lifted floral notes. Silky tannins and refined structure highlight the château's signature elegance, while 12–14 months in French oak adds subtle cedar and spice without overshadowing the fruit. The warmth of the vintage brings generosity and depth, balanced by fresh Médoc acidity that keeps the palate long and graceful. Consistently one of the best-value classed growths — polished, harmonious and drinking beautifully now, with another decade of evolution ahead.

FRANCE — BORDEAUX (PAUILLAC)

414. Pichon Longueville Comtesse de Lalande 1989 — €1820 R • C

A landmark vintage of Pichon Comtesse, offering extraordinary depth and refined power. Aromas of blackcurrant, cedar, tobacco leaf and graphite unfold with remarkable purity. The palate is velvety yet structured, showing layers of cassis, truffle, dried rose and warm spice. Perfectly mature tannins give a seamless texture and prolonged finish. 415. Château Lynch-Bages 2003 — €1040 R • C

416. Château Pontet-Canet 2019 — €420 R • C

The 2019 vintage is a biodynamic triumph, showing exceptional purity and definition: layers of blackcurrant, blackberry, violets and graphite glide across a velvety, seamless palate. The estate's meticulous vineyard work gives the wine an almost Burgundian finesse, while retaining the unmistakable structure and depth of top-tier Pauillac. Rated 96–99 points by major critics, this is a luxurious, architectural, long-ageing wine offering extraordinary value beside its First-Growth neighbours. Silky, powerful and beautifully composed — a flagship bottle for collectors and special occasions.

417. Château Grand-Puy-Lacoste 1992 — €280 R • C

One of the standout performers of a challenging vintage. Mature cassis, cedar, tobacco leaf and savoury spice glide across softened, refined tannins. A charming, evolved claret that showcases the beauty of traditional Fifth-Growth Pauillac in maturity. Elegant, understated and ready to enjoy.

418. Château Grand-Puy Ducasse 2003 — €190 R • C

Cassis, cedar and subtle tobacco with firm, classic Pauillac structure. Polished, mature and expressive. A refined claret from an excellent vintage.

419. Château Lynch-Moussas 2000 — €180 R • C

Dark fruit, liquorice and soft herbs with silky texture and depth. Harmonious and elegant with beautifully integrated tannins. Drinking at a superb stage.

FRANCE — BORDEAUX (MARGAUX)

420. Château Larruau 2019 — €72 R • C

Classic, elegant Margaux showing ripe cassis, violets and supple polished tannins. Silky, aromatic and refined, with the lifted floral perfume the appellation is known for. Family-owned estate delivering true Margaux finesse without the grand cru pricing. A beautifully balanced, quietly luxurious claret — exceptional value for Margaux

421. Château Rauzan-Ségla 2003 — €290 R • C

Deep cassis, violets, fine oak and polished tannins. Silky, aromatic and long, capturing the hallmark elegance of Margaux. A superb bottle for the price.

422. Château Siran 2018 — €95 R • C

Youthful, structured Margaux with blackcurrant, cedar and smooth tannins. Modern, vibrant and balanced — excellent value in the appellation.

FRANCE — BORDEAUX (SAINT-ESTÈPHE)

425. Château Cos d'Estournel 1988 — €1280 R • C

A classic Saint-Estèphe showing the structured, savoury depth characteristic of the 1988 vintage. Aromas of cassis, cedar, leather and dried herbs rise from the glass with precision. Owned by the Cazes family of Château Lynch-Bages, Ormes de Pez is one of Saint-Estèphe's great over-performers.

The 2020 vintage shows concentrated cassis, black plum and tobacco leaf with notes of cedar, graphite and fresh herbs.

Firm yet polished tannins reflect the appellation's signature structure, while the fruit remains vibrant and pure thanks to meticulous vineyard management.

A superb introduction to Saint-Estèphe, offering depth, personality and classic left-bank character at outstanding value.

FRANCE — BORDEAUX (POMEROL)

427. Château Beauregard 2019 — €164 R • C

428. Château Bellegrave 2021 — €135 R • C

Plum, blackberry and fine oak with polished tannins; from gravel-clay soils just south of Feytit-Clinet, showing the classic purity and graceful structure that define traditional Pomerol. A refined, quietly impressive estate ideal for guests wanting "true Pomerol" without paying Petrus-sector prices

429. Château L'Enclos 2020 — €130 R • C

Dark fruit, floral lift and silky tannins; located on the western plateau beside Clos René with gravel-clay soils that give balance, finesse and a gentle mineral line. A beautifully composed Pomerol ideal for those wanting elegance over density.

430. Château Fayat 2016 — €120 R • C

Black cherry, cassis and mocha over firm, modern tannins; sourced from vineyards neighbouring Clinet and Montviel, combining rich Merlot fruit with a contemporary, well-defined structure. A strong choice for guests who enjoy a bolder, more powerful expression of Pomerol.

431. Château La Patache 2021 — €95 R • C

Dark berries, spice and bright acidity with clean structure; from parcels near Montviel and Nenin, producing a vibrant, youthful expression that balances modern precision with classic Pomerol charm. Excellent for guests seeking freshness over weight.

432. Château Montviel 2020 — €95 R • C

Blue fruit, violets and fine tannins with excellent freshness; from vineyards in the Clinet/Trotanoy sector, producing a polished, expressive and extremely food-friendly Pomerol. A strong all-rounder and a favourite pick for Merlot lovers.

433. Ballade de La Pointe 2019 — €85 R

Ripe dark fruit and smooth texture with supple tannins; crafted from gravel-sand parcels surrounding Château La Pointe, offering a softer, more approachable Pomerol style. Ideal for guests seeking authentic Pomerol character at exceptional value.

434. By CLINET 2017 — €100 R • C

Refined, modern Bordeaux crafted by the winemaking team behind Château Clinet in Pomerol. The 2017 vintage delivers vibrant red and black fruit — plum, cherry and cassis — wrapped in silky tannins with notes of cocoa, graphite and gentle spice.

Freshness from the cooler year adds lift and precision, while subtle oak provides polish without heaviness. Elegant, versatile and beautifully balanced.

435. Château Mazeyres 2020 — €86 R • C

A beautifully supple, modern Pomerol offering elegance without heaviness.

Ripe red plum, cherry and hints of violets unfold over silky, fine-grained tannins, with gentle notes of cocoa and soft cedar from restrained oak ageing. The estate lies on the southern edge of the Pomerol plateau, close to Château Nénin, giving the wine its characteristic plush Merlot texture and refined, polished style. 441. Preignes Le Vieux Cabernet Sauvignon 2023 — €32 R

Blackcurrant, plum and soft spice with smooth tannins. Medium-bodied, clean and approachable. Excellent everyday red.

LEBANON

442. Château Musar 1998 — €260 R • C

Legendary vintage from Lebanon's most iconic estate. The 1998 shows Musar at full maturity: dried red berries, plum, warm spice, cedar, leather and subtle volatility that adds lift rather than weight. Long bottle ageing has softened the tannins into a silken texture, letting its complex mix of earth, tobacco, fig and old-world savouriness unfold in layers. Made from ungrafted vines in the Bekaa Valley, fermented in concrete and aged in old French oak — a style closer to fine old Bordeaux than modern Lebanon. A benchmark Musar vintage that continues to evolve in the glass, offering both history and hedonism.

USA — NAPA & SONOMA

443. Opus One 1985 — €1350 R • C

A rare early vintage created under the historic partnership of Baron Philippe de Rothschild and Robert Mondavi. The bouquet is expansive, offering violets, cassis, cigar box and dried plum with remarkable aromatic clarity. The palate is graceful and deeply layered, showing silky tannins and a harmonious blend of Cabernet and Bordeaux-inspired finesse. Notes of cedar, cocoa, black cherry and warm spice extend into a long, elegant finish. A collectors' wine of significant cultural importance and one of the finest early expressions of Opus One.

444. Cakebread Cabernet Sauvignon 2020 — €170 R • C

A benchmark Napa Valley Cabernet from one of California's most respected family estates. The 2020 vintage delivers dense blackcurrant, blackberry and ripe plum layered with cocoa, espresso and warm spice from carefully integrated French oak.

The palate is plush and powerful, yet refined, with polished tannins and vibrant Napa acidity giving balance and drive. Hints of graphite, bay leaf and dark chocolate add depth, reflecting the meticulous vineyard selection across Rutherford and other top valley-floor sites. Long, silky and modern in style — a luxurious, crowd-pleasing Cabernet offering the richness and pedigree that define classic Napa Valley.

445. The Federalist Zinfandel 2014 — €60 R

Warm, full-bodied Zinfandel with plum, blackberry and sweet spice. Smooth, generous and very approachable. A crowd-pleasing American red.

ARGENTINA

456. Staphyle Partida Limitada Malbec 2020 — €49 R

Rich, dark-fruited Malbec with blueberry, plum and soft vanilla. Smooth, rounded and very drinkable. Great value for lovers of full-bodied reds.

457. Pyros Malbec “Single Vineyard Block No.4” 2019 — €59 R • C

A powerful, high-altitude Malbec from the exceptional Pedernal Valley, showing blackberry, blackcurrant and wild herbs with a lifted violet perfume. Fine, mineral tannins and cool-climate freshness give unusual precision and elegance for a wine of this depth. Aged in French oak for added cocoa and spice, the palate is long, structured and beautifully balanced. One of Argentina's most awarded Malbecs — 96 Points, Tim Atkin. A superb premium choice for steak and rich dishes.

AUSTRALIA

458. Tahbilk Shiraz 2020 — €40 R

Plum, spice and anise with smooth, lingering tannins. Classic Australian Shiraz style with medium-full body and bright acidity. Excellent value.

459. Mount Langi Ghiran “Cliff Edge” Shiraz | 2017 — €50 R • C

Cool-climate Shiraz with dark berries, black pepper and lifted violet aromatics. Silky tannins and mineral freshness underscore its Grampians origins, offering purity and finesse. A savoury, beautifully textured Shiraz with remarkable balance and length. One of Australia's most respected estates — refined, expressive and cellar-worthy.

460. Peter Lehmann “Stonewell” Shiraz 1996 — €976 R • C

One of Australia's great age-worthy Shiraz wines, sourced from some of the Barossa's oldest low-yielding vineyards. The 1996 vintage shows extraordinary depth: black cherry, plum and blackberry layered with dark chocolate, cedar, tobacco and warm spice. Silky, resolved tannins carry a long, complex finish with hints of leather and dried herbs. Now fully mature, Stonewell offers the richness of Barossa Shiraz with the elegance that only decades of bottle age can bring. A rare, cellar-statement bottle for collectors and special occasions.

461. d'Arenberg “The Dead Arm” Shiraz 2005 — €445 R • C

A benchmark McLaren Vale Shiraz from one of Australia's most distinctive producers. Concentrated blackberry, mulberry and plum are wrapped in layers of liquorice, graphite, smoked meat and peppery spice. The 2005 vintage is powerful yet beautifully balanced, with firm but velvety tannins and deep savoury complexity. Long, intense and evolving in the glass, this is a true Australian classic — bold, characterful and unmistakably “Dead Arm.” A perfect choice if your seeking richness and depth without moving into Barossa's heavier style.

NEW ZEALAND

465. Paddy Borthwick “Paper Road” Pinot Noir 2020 — €40 R

Morello cherry, soft spice and supple tannins. Juicy and medium-bodied with smooth texture. A crowd-friendly, modern NZ Pinot.

466. Tohu Pinot Noir “Awatere Valley” 2021 — €50 R • C

Beautifully aromatic Pinot Noir from Marlborough’s Awatere Valley, offering red cherry, wild strawberry and subtle floral notes with a fine, silky texture. The cool coastal climate brings freshness and minerality, balancing the ripe fruit with precision and lift. Supple tannins and gentle French oak add elegance without heaviness, making it exceptionally versatile at the table. A refined, New World Pinot with Burgundian finesse — perfect for guests seeking a lighter, elegant red.

DESSERT WINES

482. Zeltinger Sonnenuhr Riesling Auslese – Selbach-Oster 2003 (37.5cl) — €66 C

A beautifully mature Auslese showing honeysuckle, apricot and baked pear wrapped in elegant sweetness. Bright acidity keeps the wine lifted and precise despite its richness. Layers of citrus oil, blossom and gentle minerality add depth. Silky, long and impeccably balanced — a superb late-harvest Riesling with real finesse.

483. Inniskillin Icewine – Riesling 2002 (50cl) — €150 C

Intensely concentrated aromas of peach, mango, lychee and honey leap from the glass. The palate is opulent and luxurious with vibrant, crystalline acidity that prevents any heaviness. 484. Tokaji Aszú 5 Puttonyos “Blue Label” 1991 (50cl) — €190 C

A classic sweet Tokaji offering toffee, raisin, dried orange peel and warm honeyed depth. The texture is rich yet elegant, defined by refreshing acidity and noble rot complexity. Long, layered finish with hints of caramel and subtle spice. A beautifully aged example of Hungary's historic dessert wine.

485. Tokaji Aszú 5 Puttonyos “Nyulászó” 1991 (50cl) — €265 C

From a revered First Growth single vineyard, this wine delivers apricot jam, acacia honey, dried citrus and exotic spice. Deeply complex with a luxurious palate and lively acidity. The finish is exceptionally long, combining sweetness with freshness. A rare bottle for collectors and connoisseurs.

486. Torres Late Harvest Riesling 2010 (37.5cl) — €35 C

Aromatic and expressive, offering apricot, wild honey, quince and warm spice. Sweet but not heavy, with bright acidity providing clarity and lift. Silky texture and an elegant, gently lingering finish. An excellent introduction to late-harvest wines.

487. Vin Santo di Montepulciano “Romeo” 1991 (50cl) — €95 C

Rich and deeply flavoured with dried apricot, toasted nuts, caramel and warming spice. Balanced sweetness supported by clean acidity and a long, savoury finish. Traditionally made Vin Santo with decades of evolution, ideal alongside biscotti or blue cheese.

488. Château Rieussec 1er Cru Classé Sauternes 1982 — €425 C

An exquisitely mature Sauternes offering crème brûlée, dried pineapple, honeycomb and candied citrus framed by gentle botrytis richness. The palate is silky and luxurious, with notes of apricot, toasted almond and soft spice blending seamlessly. Acidity remains bright enough to give lift and precision despite its age. The finish is long, warming and deeply layered. A rare, beautifully preserved First Growth Sauternes from a quietly excellent vintage, ideal for cheese or dessert.

489. Amber Hors d'Age Rivesaltes 1974 — €45 C

Golden Grenache matured for decades, showing caramel, dried fig, hazelnut and warm spice. Silky, mellow and subtly sweet with a nutty, oxidative complexity. Perfect alongside chocolate desserts or blue cheese.

Deep amber with nutty aromas, warm spice and dried fruit. The palate is dry, savoury and complex with impressive length. A versatile style that pairs effortlessly with nuts, white meats and aged cheeses. A benchmark Amontillado.

495. Lustau Palo Cortado “Peninsula” (375ml) — €35 C

A rare style combining the finesse of Amontillado with the richness of Oloroso. Aromas of toasted nuts, orange peel and gentle caramel lead into a dry, structured palate. Elegant, complex and deeply expressive. A favourite of sherry enthusiasts.

496. Lustau Pedro Ximénez “San Emilio” (375ml) — €40 C

Velvety and intensely sweet with fig, raisin, date syrup and cocoa. Thick, luxurious texture balanced by gentle acidity. Incredible poured over vanilla ice cream or enjoyed alongside rich chocolate desserts. A powerhouse PX.

PORT

500. Graham’s Vintage Port 1985 (700ml) — €540 C

A monumental vintage port with concentrated black fruit, spice, liquorice and mature balsamic notes. Full-bodied, powerful and beautifully structured with immense length. Silky tannins and deep complexity after decades of ageing. A collector's classic.

501. Taylor's Vintage Port 1985 (700ml) — €375 C

Opulent aromas of dark berry, cacao and baking spice with a rich, layered palate. Firm but refined tannins support the wine's intensity. Long, expressive finish with evolving depth. A superb vintage now entering peak maturity.

502. Sandeman Vintage Port 1977 (700ml) — €360 C

A mature port displaying dried fig, chocolate, spice and nutty complexity. Smooth and harmonious with a beautifully evolved palate. Elegant and balanced with a soft, lingering finish. A definitive vintage for Sandeman.

503. Croft Vintage Port 1977 (700ml) — €360 C

Dark chocolate, rich berry compote, warm spice and silky texture. Full-bodied yet smooth with excellent development and refined sweetness. A distinguished port for special occasions.

504. Sandeman Vintage Port 1967 (700ml) — €480 C

A rare, beautifully aged wine offering toffee, dried fruit, nut brittle and warm caramel. Smooth, mellow and deeply complex. A remarkable bottle from a historic vintage.

505. Graham's Late Bottled Vintage 1995 (700ml) — €90 C

Ripe blackberry, gentle spice and rounded sweetness. Approachable and fruit-forward with soft tannins and a smooth finish. An excellent introduction to vintage-style port.

506. Taylor's 10-Year-Old Tawny NV (700ml) — €90 C

Amber-gold with caramel, roasted nuts and dried fruit. Silky texture with mellow sweetness and bright acidity. A classic Tawny showing balance and elegance. Ideal with cheese or dessert.

ARMAGNAC — CHÂTEAU DE LAUBADE

490. Laubade Bas-Armagnac 1971 (35.5ml) — €41

Deep mahogany spirit offering plum, candied fruit, tobacco leaf and warming spice. Silky yet powerful on the palate with extraordinary length. A beautifully matured vintage Armagnac.

491. Laubade Bas-Armagnac 1981 (35.5ml) — €20

Golden, elegant and lightly spiced with notes of dried apricot, caramel and gentle oak. Smooth, refined and superbly balanced. Double Gold – San Francisco World Spirits Competition.

492. Laubade “Intemporel No.5” (35.5ml) — €20

A prestigious blend of more than 40 eaux-de-vie centred on Baco. Rich aromas of dried fruit, toasted nuts and baking spice. The palate is silky, expressive and beautifully layered. Awarded “Worldwide Best Brandy”.
